



A Brief Summary of the Direct Aid coming to Texas as part of the 2021 American Rescue Plan Act

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 provides 27.6 billion dollars to Texas for state and local recovery. The state government will receive 17.2 billion, while the remaining 10.4 billion will be distributed directly to our 254 counties and more than 1,100 cities.

While you cannot use the funds to offset prior lost tax revenue or to deposit into a pension fund, there are several ways to use the money properly. A few of these allowable activities are listed below:

- Provide aid to local businesses, households, or non-profits.
- Provide increased “premium” pay to essential workers
- Provide government services that may have been reduced due to a reduction in revenue
- Make investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

All Texas recipients will receive their funds in 2 tranches. The first tranche will be approximately 50% of the total allocation and will be received sometime in the next 30-45 days. The second tranche will follow approximately 12 months later. While it is exciting to receive this money, it can be overwhelming to suddenly receive federal funds with little guidance on the use and regulatory requirements. Each city or county will have the responsibility to manage these funds, navigating proper procurement procedures, and reporting on their expenditures regularly to the US Treasury Department.
